Identify that living things have a habitat to which they are suited.  Identify and name different plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats.  Describe how animals get their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain.  <b><u>Animals including humans</u></b>  Understand that animals, including humans, have offspring (babies) which grow into adults.  Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).  Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.</p>	<p><b><u>DT - Puppets</u></b>  Explore different types of puppets  Learn how to join materials using sewing techniques  Sew pieces of felt to make a hand puppet and add features</p> <p><b><u>Art - African Drawing</u></b>  Explore the work of Edward Saidi Tingatinga  Develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
